Sometimes we come to choose some risks that can make us more courageous, capable and self-confident people. There are different types of risks that we learn about as we grow up. On the one hand, there are extreme risks such as sports or dangerous things and there are also those risks from which we cannot escape because they are part of who we are and will always be. Our daily life is made up of choosing; choose to grow and develop or choose to stay where we are. For those of us who believe in being better, there are risks that are worth it.

During my school years the subject that was most difficult for me was English. I was never, nor am I, the best in this language and even if I was, I have taken the risk of beginning to read and translate little by little what I find in English. The fact of occasionally imposing the language on me, whether in small phrases, subtitles, or songs, has made me gain knowledge as far as English is concerned. By taking this risk I have been able to flow a little more when addressed in our second language. It's the only risk I've ever willingly taken. On the other hand, although I have had to face colleagues whose main language is English, the fact of producing it orally scares me. This is a risk that I normally do not take because my fear of being wrong has stopped me many times. I'm scared of mispronouncing something and that it might be misunderstood. Even so, I am currently working as a secretary in a medical office where students from many countries come to do their rotations. Due to this, to communicate with them I have needed to resort to my English production orally, a risk that I would never take regularly out of fear. Although it has not been the best English, they have managed to understand me, and I know that this will help me in the future in any situation. Sometimes I hesitate too much but it is part of growing and developing in something and, although I am still very hesitant to take that risk, there always comes a time when I need to carry it out.
